## TSA Information for Parents and Students

The Department of Homeland Security and the Transportation Security Administration have authority over airline travel and security of airports. All airline passengers must comply with their requirements.

**Q.** What do we need to know about TSA procedures?

**A.** There are two very important elements in current TSA passenger screening requirements.

### Secure Flight Passenger Data

All Passengers must provide

**Full Name** (First, Middle, Last)

**Date of Birth, Gender**

- Information must be provided prior to issuance of airline ticket.
- Name must exactly match passenger's ID.
- Individuals under 18 are not required to have ID to check in, but they are required to provide data for Secure Flight Passenger Data Screening.

### Airport Security Screening

All Passengers must be screened

**3 - Liquids & Gels 3 oz. or smaller size only**

**1 - Placed in 1 qt. clear plastic bag**

**1 - One Bag per person**

- Laptops in Separate Security Bin
- Shoes & Jackets Removed
- Hand-carry Boarding Pass and ID
- ID must match Secure Flight Passenger Data

**Q.** Our student goes by a nickname. Is that the name he/she should use?

**A.** No. The TSA requires legal names of all individuals.

**Q.** What if our child is under 18? Does he/she still need ID?

**A.** TSA does not require ID from persons under 18. However, they are required to submit their full, legal names for pre-screening. We also recommend that if a wallet-sized birth certificate is available, it be brought along as proof of identity and age.

**Q.** If a student is under 18 and not required to present ID, what is considered their legal name?

**A.** If a student has a Driver's License, their legal name would be the one on their Driver's License. If they do not have a Driver's License, their legal name would be the name on their birth certificate.

**Q.** What is the pre-screening information used for?

**A.** The TSA compares the data provided by each passenger to terror watch lists and no-fly lists. If there is any irregularity, the airline will be prevented from issuing a boarding pass.

**Q.** If a student is over 18 and required to present ID but they do not have a Driver's License, what should we do?

**A.** All individuals age 18 and over must present valid (not-expired) ID. If the student does not have a Driver's License he/she will need to present an alternate form of ID, such as a Passport.
